On-Time Graduation Rate:

A continuously enrolled full-time student who successfully completes all of his or her courses will normally complete in 20 months. The time normally required for program completion may be reduced through courses credited by transfer or proficiency, or extend by course failures and withdrawals, institutional withdrawals, leave of absence, developmental courses, change of enrollment status from full-time to part-time, and change of program or an elective option within an program. In the year July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2010, 3 of the program's 3 graduate (100%) completed the program in 20 months.

Career Placement:

Placement refers to employment in the field for which the graduate's education has prepared him or her, or in a related field with requires substantial application of the skills and knowledge taught in the curriculum.

The placement rate is determined by dividing the number of available graduates placed by the total number of available graduates.

For those who graduated from the program between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010 the career placement rate was 100%.
